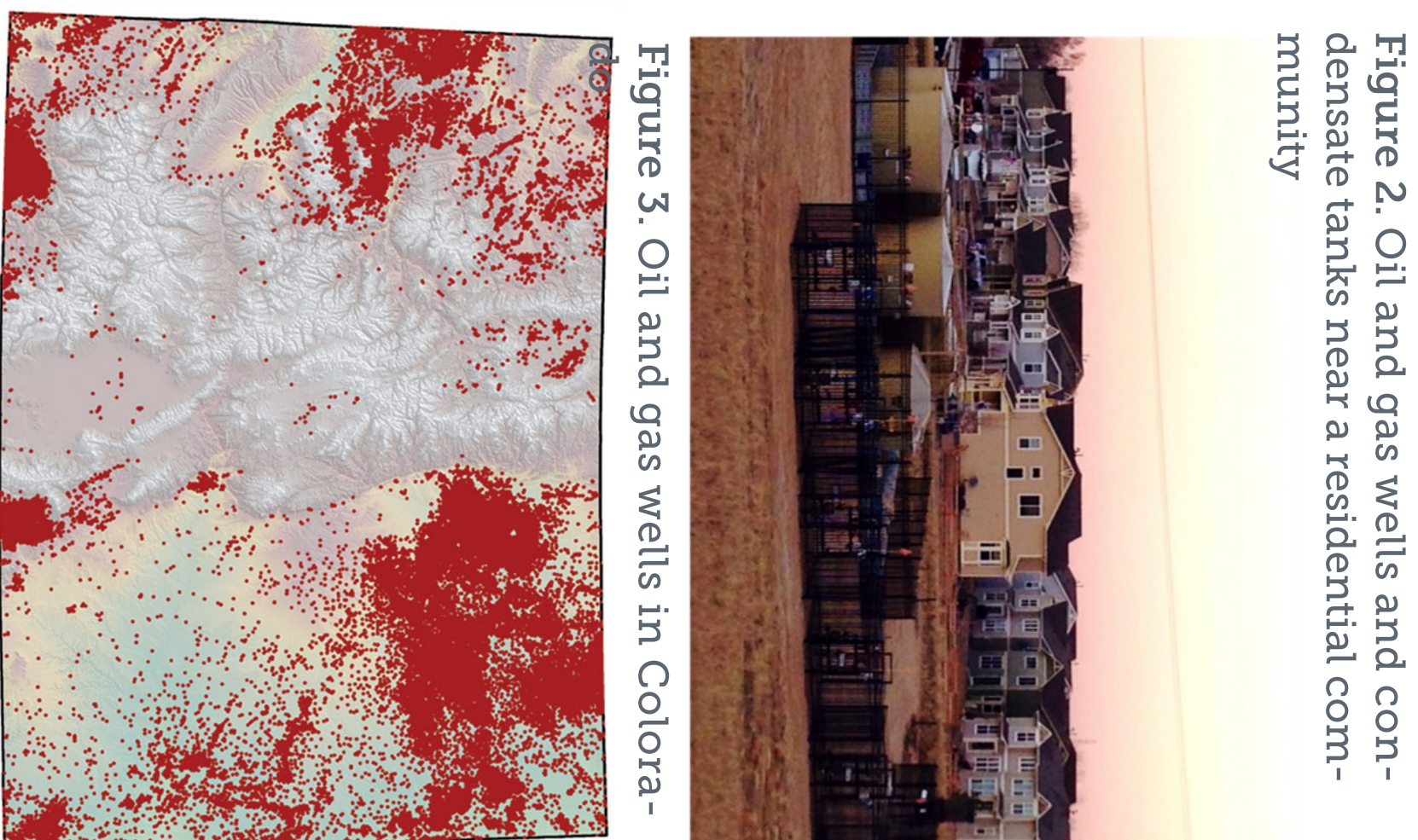
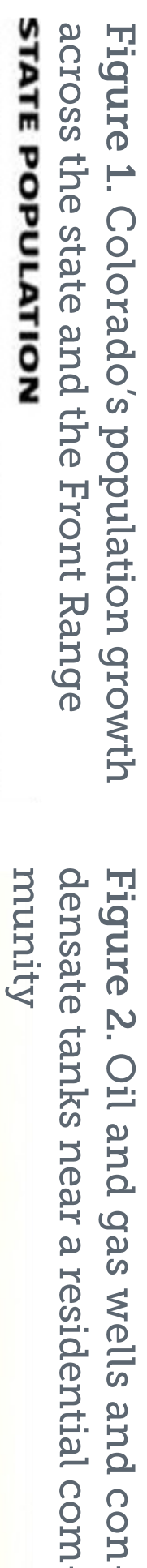

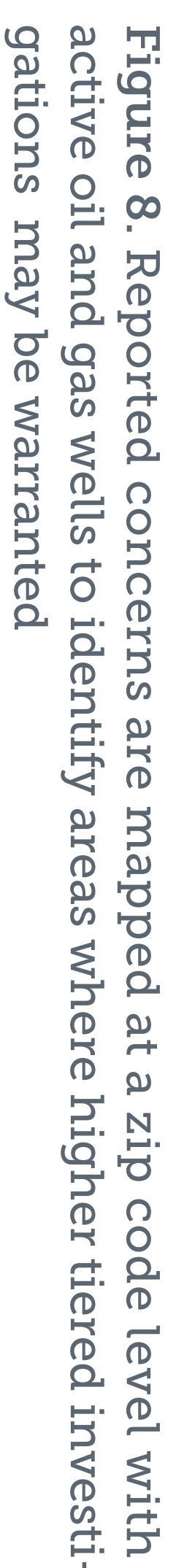
Track and Respond to Citizen Health Concerns

Gain credibility with stakeholders



Within the CDPHE's Disease Control and Environmental Epidemiology Division, the Oil and Gas Health Information and Response Program works closely with other divisions within CDPHE and the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission housed within the Department of Natural Resources. Outreach and stakeholder relationship building includes collaborative efforts with industry, local governments, federal agencies and other oil and gas producing states.



1. A clearinghouse of information is available on our website that provides resources for in-depth information on many aspects related to O&G such as water quality, regulations, operations and air quality.
2. Communication materials/ factsheets have been created to disseminate information to the public.

3. Our report, *Assessment of Potential Public Health Effects from Oil and Gas Operations in Colorado*, has concluded: "At this time, results from exposure and health effect studies do not indicate the need for immediate public health action, but rather indicate the need for more detailed exposure monitoring and systematic analyses of health effects of residents living near oil and gas operations."
4. A comprehensive Human Health Risk Assessment will be conducted by a third-party contractor. It will use the latest and most accurate air emissions data from studies and help to provide answers to important questions
